CONTEXT

In Chapter 3, the author of Hebrews continues the argument that Jesus Christ is greater, but shifts the comparison from Angels to Moses. Moses is one of the greatest figures in the history of the nation of Israel. He is considered to be one of the greatest prophets and would have been held in the highest regard by the audience that this letter was written.

READ

Heb. 3:1-6

DISCUSS

What do you know about the life of Moses?

What is the illustration in verse 3 that the author uses to demonstrate Christ being greater than Moses? How does this help you understand the point of this verse?

DISCUSS CONTINUED

What was Moses' role in "God's house" vs. Christ's role? Discuss the difference between the two and what that means.

This passage starts with "consider Jesus" and ends with "hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope." What does it mean to "consider Jesus," "hold fast our confidence," and "boasting in our hope"?

NEXT STEPS

Remember that the original audience for this letter was suffering intense persecution. The author encourages them to "consider Jesus," hold fast our confidence," and "boast in our hope" because this is the only way to weather the storm.

Whether you are in the middle of a storm or not, what is one thing you can do this week to "consider Jesus?"
