## **Course Description:**

Heroes of the faith are those individuals that were changed by the power of God and give us an example of what God can do in a life surrendered. The lives of these individuals inspire us to do what they did or at least see their example as unique and give us the courage to follow God's call. We will explore 30 examples of surrendered lives that grew great faith and challenge our hearts to follow in their steps.

- Identify with individuals from history that were changed by God and changed the world around them
- Have a general knowledge of individuals that shaped the church we know today
- Have a resource for additional study with individuals that inspire them

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## Methodology

We will discuss the lives of three individuals each week through small and large group discussion. The student will read three chapters a week in preparation for class and bring knowledge of the individuals to class to discuss their example and impact. This will be a speed class to introduce students to a large number of individuals to awaken interest for further study. You are not required to speak in front of the class but are required to participate in the small group exercises.
