Spring 2022 Course Offerings:

Biblical Leadership 102 @ 6:30 pm - Led by Lt. Col. Michael Paulk

Biblical Leadership 102 is an interactive group experience that will take you on a journey of personal discovery and transformation. As a result of this 10-week course, you will discover biblical leadership traits to lead you, your family, and your team through today's volatile, uncertain, complex, and ambiguous world. Each week will involve reading assignments and reflections with homework that can be used profitably by all people in a position to lead others – whether in business or ministry, in the school or the home.

Identity in Christ @ 6:30 pm - Led by Dara Bevars & Russ Ritchell

Often as Christians, we find ourselves leading busy and barren lives, which is never how God intended. This course sheds light on the neglected half of the Gospel, the Great Exchange that occurs the moment we accept Christ and how by walking in our identity in Christ, we can experience true freedom. You were meant for so much more!

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Theology 102 @ 7:30 pm – Led by Mark Otstot

This is the second of four courses in a general survey of Bible doctrine designed to introduce the student to the major areas of systematic theology. This course presents the following areas of doctrine: the doctrine of the person and work of Christ (Christology), the Holy Spirit (Pneumatology), and salvation (Soteriology).

Bible Study Methods @ 7:30 pm – Led by David Staggers

The focus of this course will be on developing and presenting a Bible study based upon a verse-by-verse approach. In this class, you will learn the three stages in creating a Bible study, understand the basic principles of effective teaching, and learn practical guidelines for presenting a Bible study.

Spiritual Formations @ 8:30 pm – Led by David Staggers

God desires for each follower of Christ to walk with Him. To walk with Him daily, we must develop disciplines in our lives to ensure consistency and growth in this walk. This course is designed to guide the student through an understanding of spiritual disciplines, the elements of spiritual discipline, and practice incorporating the disciplines into their lives.

Theology 101 @ 8:30 pm - Led by Mark Otstot

This is the first of four courses in a general survey of Bible doctrine designed to introduce the student to the major areas of systematic theology. This course presents the following areas of doctrine:

- Nature and task of Systematic Theology
- The doctrine of the Bible (Bibliology)
