# **Course Description:**

This is the third of four courses in a general survey of Bible doctrine designed to introduce the student to the major areas of systematic theology. This course presents the following areas of doctrine: the doctrines of the person and work of the Holy Spirit (Pneumatology), the doctrines concerning angels and demons (Angelology), and the doctrines pertaining to man and sin (Anthropology and Hamartiology).

# **Learning and Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Analyze the principal agents and ideas that shape classic and contemporary systematic theology in relation to the Holy Spirit, angels, demons, man, and sin.
- Discuss key doctrinal terms and their definitions as they relate to Pneumatology, Angelology, Anthropology, and Hamartiology.
- Examine the classic and modern questions regarding spiritual gifts, demon possession, and the problem concerning the existence of evil.
- Integrate and synthesize the material into her or his theological worldview.
- Respond biblically to current ethical questions.
