## Theology 102

### **Course Description**

This is the second of four courses in a general survey of Bible doctrine designed to introduce the student to the major areas of systematic theology. This course presents the following areas of doctrine: the doctrines of the person and work of Christ (Christology), the Holy Spirit (Pneumatology), and salvation (Soteriology).

### **Learning and Outcomes**

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Analyze the principal agents and ideas that shape classic and contemporary systematic theology in relation to Christ, the Holy Spirit, and salvation
- Discuss key doctrinal terms and their definitions as they relate to Systematic Theology, Christology, Pneumatology, and Soteriology.
- Examine the classic and modern questions regarding the person and work of Christ and of the Holy Spirit.
- Discuss the nature and work of both Christ and the Holy Spirit in the act of salvation of man.
- Analyze and discuss the four classical theological views of the Ordo Salutis
